Not complying with a Public Health Order Usually made by an authorised medical practitioner & <u>must</u> be in writing	The Order can ask you to comply, submit, engage, refrain, or undergo to do things. Maximum penalty— \$11.,000 Fine and/or imprisonment for 6 months; Note: Police can arrest an individual pursuant to COVID-19 contravention and you can be returned to your place of residence. Ss 62-71A of the Public Health Act 2010
Fail to comply with a Direction under Part 8	Maximum penalty— \$5,500 fine s113 <i>Public Health Act 2010</i>
Giving false information purporting to comply	Maximum penalty—
with a Direction under Part 8	\$11,000 Fine and/or imprisonment for 6 months s113 of the <i>Public Health Act 2010</i>
Coughing or spitting on health workers, police,	\$5,000 on the spot fine

THINGS TO NOTE:

**** search and seize powers**: an authorised officer may enter premises and seize material <u>only if</u> they have a <u>search warrant</u> or <u>certificate of authority</u> and they show you a copy of the search warrant. Section 108 (2) *Public Health Act 2010*

****name and address:** authorised officer (including a police officer) can ask an individual to provide their full name and residential address, if they suspect there is a contravention of the *Public Health Act 2010. S112 Public Health Act 2010.*

****notification after death:** COVID19 is a **Scheduled Medical Condition** (Part 4, *Public Health Act 2010*) and after registering the death of an individual you <u>must notify</u> the Secretary of the Registrar of Births, Deaths and Marriages in an approved form, of the following:

- (a) the name, address and age of the deceased, and
- (b) the name of the scheduled medical condition, and
- (c) the name of the person who certified the cause of death, and
- (d) such other particulars as may be prescribed by the regulations.
